


CALLING ON VOLUNTEERS TO SERVE LUNCH AT BE ABLE!

FORT HAYS STATE UNIVERSITY RODEO CLUB

HALL OF FAME

One of the most significant events of the rodeo weekend at Fort Hays State University was the induction and grand celebration of three new members of the Rodeo Hall of Fame: Dr. Garry Brower, Colette Graves, and Joe Hedrick. Their achievements are a testament to the excellence and dedication the FHSU rodeo community upholds, inspiring us all to strive for greatness.



Dr. Garry "Doc" Brower was a professor in the FHSU Department of Agriculture from 1976-2012, earning a reputation as the most respected and the toughest, orneriest instructor in the department. Garry once shared his experience at FHSU, "I accepted a position at Fort Hays on the basis I would be here one year, which turned into 36. After one semester, I was hooked." During his early years at FHSU, he was an advisor to the Block and Bridle Club and coached the horse judging team. In 1981, Doc became the rodeo club Faculty Advisor. At that time, it was more of a campus-wide social organization than a competitive organization. During his years at the helm, it progressed to a point where they had both indoor and outdoor arenas, plenty of practice stock, scholarships, and university financial support. Garry was always up to



something, so to illustrate the economic impact of the rodeo to the community, he began the tradition of giving \$2 bills for change at the annual rodeo. That caught everyone's attention; there isn't a convenient place for a \$2 bill in a cash drawer!

In 2011, as a testament to Dr. Brower's dedication to college rodeo, FHSU, his students, and their education, rodeo alumni, former students, and friends established and endowed the "Doc" Garry R Brower scholarship. This enduring tribute continues to benefit club members, leaving a lasting impact on their lives and the FHSU rodeo community.

The induction of Dr. Garry Brower into the Rodeo Hall of Fame was a moment of immense pride and honor for his family. His wife Ruby, son Justin, daughter-in-law Kathy, granddaughters Claire and Jenna, and sister and brother-in-law Linda and Jim Watkins were present to celebrate this significant achievement and accept the commemorative buckle.



DISCIPLES MEN

Our journey in life with God relies on faith. Faith in knowing God exists, that he is present with us and will be there in times of need. When Jesus walked the earth, many saw his face, how tall he was, what color his eyes were, the shape of his hands, his facial expressions and more. However, none of that is described in the scriptures. We are left to imagine the details of his appearance. Anthropologists have studied first-century middle easterners and even recently researchers have used artificial intelligence to produce images of Jesus' appearance. Most of these images are in sharp contrast to the illustrations of Jesus we all grew up seeing in Sunday school or in paintings on church walls.

If you are like me, I want to know what Jesus looked like. I do not think it is wrong to want to know this about him. I believe that when I meet Jesus his appearance may totally surprise me. However, I think there will be an undeniable revelation, an immediate recognition of whose presence I am in. I believe there will be unequivocal affirmation that I am in His presence.



Since that may not happen in my lifetime, my faith journey can and does offer other tangible ways that God becomes recognizable. We have all heard how we see God in the birth of our children, the magnificence of God's creations in spectacular sunsets, seeing the ocean for the first time, witnessing mountain vistas, perhaps even when viewing a total solar eclipse. These illustrations are like that for me.

Recognizing God's presence will be different for each of us. I know I need to spend more time consciously looking for God...not just during rare and special life experiences, but in everyday living. What does Jesus look like to you? Where do you see him? Are you looking for Him?
