THE BEATITUDES

- Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven.
- Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.
- Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.
- Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.
- Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.
- Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
- Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven.



Jesus was estimated to be approximately 30 years old when he gave the "Sermon on the Mount" on Mount Eremos. This is a small mountain in northern Israel near the town of Tabqha on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. The location is between Capernaum and Tabqha and overlooks the fields of Gennesaret. Today, the mountain is called The Mount of Beatitudes.

What are Beatitudes? The Beatitudes are eight statements attributed to Jesus Christ. Each of these statements contains a blessing for a particular group of people. The eight Beatitudes appear in the Gospel of Matthew verses 5:3 to 5:10. Four of the Beatitudes are also listed in the Gospel of Luke verse 6:22.

The word *Beatitude* comes from the Latin *beatus*, meaning, 'happy' or "fortunate." This current Beatitude definition has been attested in English since the 15th century and has long been associated specifically with the statements given by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount.

In our Christian faith, the Beatitudes in the Bible are considered very important pieces of scripture for several reasons. First, they are direct statements attributed to Jesus, giving them spiritual weight. Secondly, they provide insight into how we as Christians are meant to act and what we can expect in life and the life to come.

When did you first learn of or about the Beatitudes? How do you compare the Beatitudes to the 10 Commandments?




